A Learning About Each Other Activity

Discussion: Some children struggle to remember information about their peers, even if they spend a lot of time with them. Remembering information about others helps gain and maintain friendships by allowing us to have successful social interactions, i.e.. asking meaningful questions, making thoughtful comments, etc. This is a great activity to help children learn and remember interesting and relevant information about their peers.

Directions: Print enough for your students to each have one page, each student can have the same topic or they can have different topics. Have the students fill in the boxes accordingly by writing or drawing in their responses. Once everyone is done, have the students read off their answers, one at a time, to the group.

The next time the group meets, see if the students remember any of the items about each other. You can read off the responses and see if the kids can remember who it is. Remind the students to have a “poker face” when it is their paper that is being read. Students really enjoy doing this, have fun!

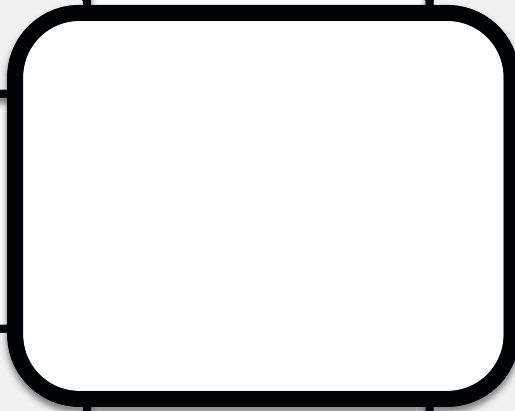
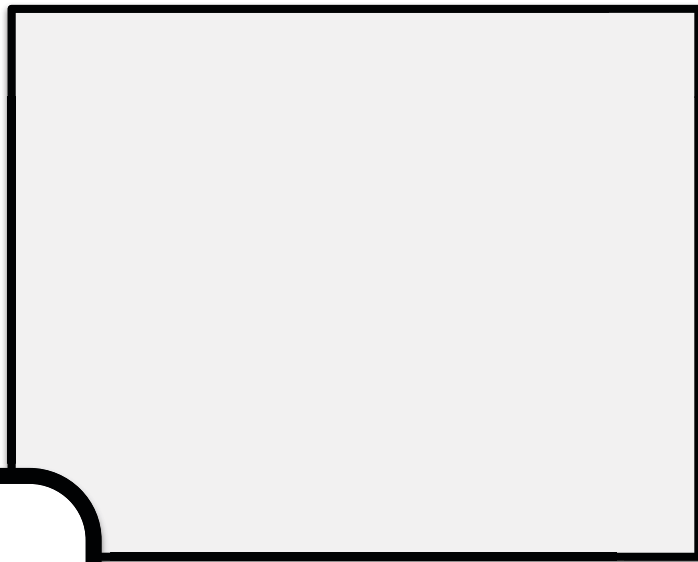
